Ambrose Chiappa, ICoS 3rd President 1972 Interview by Dennis Caldirola



Ambrose Chiappa was the third president of the Italian Club, in 1922. He was one of the small group of businessmen and professional men who had become leaders of the Italian community. This small group of men formed the early Italian Commercial Club as an instrument through which they could demonstrate to Americans the beauty of Italian culture, of which we are all so proud.

Ambrose Chiappa (1884 - 1951) was born in Cunio. He immigrated to the United States in 1909. Settling first in San Francisco, he quickly found employment with the Petri Cigar Company as a traveling salesman. He traveled far and wide throughout the west. In his travels he visited Butte, Montana, where he first met his future bride, nativeborn Anna Bozzetta, who survives her husband and is still living in Seattle.

In 1913 Ambrose married the lovely Anna and they came to Seattle. His first business venture was a cigar store but he soon formed a travel agency which he headed until his retirement in 1948. He and his wife then visited their beloved Italy several times.

Ambrose is survived by his wife Anna, son Gino, daughters Vera and Leona, nine grandchildren and seven greatgrandchildren. Chiappa typifies those men who, in adopting a new country, raised their children to be the finest of American citizens and yet passed on to them a cultural heritage they will never forget.

Louis Buty, ICoS 4th President



1972 Interview by Dennis Caldirola

Louis Buty, fourth president of the Italian Club, was a relatively young man when he was elected to the office vacated after the second term of Ambrose Chiappa (1923) and Nicola Paolella (1924). Despite his youth at the time, Louis had already established himself as a rising young attorney and a leading figure in Seattle's burgeoning Italian community.

Born August 18, 1900, Louis was the eldest son of Frank Buty Sr., an enterprising financier who, after immigrating from his native Calabria as Francesco Buttera, came to Seattle at the turn of the (4th President continues on page 3)

century and established Frank Buty & Company, a private bank at Fifth Avenue and Jackson Street where even today the Buty Building still stands. Realizing that Louis was a gifted young student, Frank saw to the fact that he had the finest education: high school at Seattle College (NoW Seattle Preparatory), St. Martin's Academy in Olympia, and college at Santa Clara where he majored in Law. Graduating with his Law degree at the early age of twenty-two, Louis returned to Seattle where he entered private practice. By the early 1930's he had become partners with Mr. Alfani and it was during that time that he held the position of Italian Consul for the Northwest region. In 1935 Louis moved to San Francisco and became increasingly involved in the shipping and crating business, a venture that was to prove highly lucrative as the nation began gearing itself towards the rising threat of war. The war proved costly for the Buty's as well, for their son Louis Jr. fell with the Marines at Iwo Jima, and finally, in 1945, Louis himself passed away.

Today Louis Buty is fondly remembered by his son Francis who is still in the shipping business in San Francisco, his daughter, Virginia, now living in San Jose, California, and his step-mother, Mrs. Frank Buty, Sr., and her descendants, currently living in Seattle.

2020-2021 Scholarship Application

The Italian Club of Seattle is awarding a single \$1,000.00 dollar scholarship. The scholarship for the 2020-2021 school year will be awarded to the student who is selected based on meeting or exceeding the scholarship qualifications (noted below). As in years past; the better the GPA, the better chance of a scholarship award.

Next steps in the scholarship process:

- April 1, 2020 Application submission window opens.
- May 31, 2020 Application submission window closes, application verification.
- June 2020 Award Recipient determined, all applicants notified of their status.
- September 2020 Award Recipient published in the *il Ficcanaso* and presented at the General Meeting.
- October 2020 Scholarship payment made to the school on behalf of the recipient.

The qualifications the recipient needs to meet or exceed are:

- 1. Parents must be in good standing for three years.
- 2. G.P.A must be 3.0 or above.
- 3. Scholarship is paid specifically for tuition, directly to a state accredited High School the recipient attends.
- 4. The scholarship amount is \$1,000.00.
- 5. The scholarship is applied only for the regular school years 9-12.

Victor Masenga, ICoS 5th President

1972 Interview by Dennis Caldirola



Victor Masenga, fifth president of the Italian Club and one of its founding fathers, served in the club's seventh term of office in 1926.

Born June 26, 1890 in Turin, Italy, Victor was interested in painting and persuaded his family to permit him to study at the Turin Art Academy where he won honors upon graduation.

In 1914 Victor planned a year's visit to the United States intending to return to Italy. After arriving, he decided to settle

and establish a business in Seattle. In September of 1916 he married Catherine Traverso and shortly thereafter their family included a son and a daughter. During this period he became increasingly active in club affairs and at the same time he established the Commercial Sign Shop, an enterprise devoted to commercial art and the artistic interior decorating of private homes and business buildings. Some of his more known accounts were Fey's Renton Theater, the "Pig and Whistle" Restaurant, and surprisingly enough, the painting of the original Indian totem pole in Pioneer Square.

Victor also worked many evenings decorating the walls of the Italian Commercial Club's new building at Ninth Avenue and Terrace Street. As a token of appreciation for his efforts, the club awarded him a plaque of Honorable Mention in 1924. Another charter member, Mike Vena, did most of the carpentry remodeling of the building. In 1925 the Italian Club Ladies Auxiliary was founded in the Masenga home.

Just prior to this, in 1924, Victor become concerned with his failing health and made a final visit to his parents in Italy. In the month of December, 1926, he died in Seattle at the early age of thirty-six. His widow, Catherine, raised the two children and remained active in the Italian Club until her death in 1963. His son, Colonel Robert Mesenga (Retired USA), his wife and their four children reside in Los Angeles where he is Senior Computer Scientist with the Computer Science Corporation. The daughter, Mrs. Leone, lives on Mercer Island with her husband and daughter, Catherine. In accord with the family tradition of active participation in the Italian Club, Mrs. Leone served as president of the Italian Club Ladies Auxiliary in 1968 and 1969.
