The Pandemic, A Cultural Center, and A New Opportunity for the Membership

Later in December please look in your email for a new opportunity to make sure the club follows the direction of the members, while utilizing technology already at our finger tips.

In light of the challenges to hold a regular General meeting during the current pandemic, Anna Popovich, the club president along with the rest of the board has decided to use electronic means to support a vote by the general membership. In this case, on a new item previously not in the budget for 2020.

The board has voted unanimously to put forward for review, & subsequent approval/denial via electronic vote (email) by the membership: The donation of twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000.00) and the pre-payment of rent for General meetings of twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000.00) for a total of fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000.00) in support of the purchase & development of the new Casa Italiana – Italian Cultural Center. The treasurer of the new Casa has confirmed the ability to receive, properly document, and support the pre-payment of rent. It may be of interest to know that the Treasurer is Jeff Vert who has been preparing this club's tax statements for some time now.

The new Casa Italiana is to be situated on a five lot piece of property in Burien already purchased by a newly formed 501c3. If approved, the \$50,000.00 (as noted above) will be put toward the capital campaign dedicated to completing the purchase & improving the space for use in the short term. Further efforts & funds will be used in the development of a commercial kitchen & meeting hall onsite. More project details have been shared in other written means, in previous editions of the *il Ficcanaso* and for some by email, as the campaign to raise the rest of the money needed has recently begun in earnest (no pun intended). The capital campaign is intended to raise nearly three million dollars in total, better than five hundred thousand has been raised thus far. 

Two Casas?

Some of the members of the club, hopefully most of us, are aware of the effort that has been undertaken to secure property in Burien to become the Casa Italiana – Italian Cultural Center.

In addition, hopefully the majority of us are also aware of an older organization also known as Casa Italiana – Italian Community Hall.

Currently both of these organizations exist and have their own active boards.

Why two Casas with similar, but different names? One may ask...

The original Casa (Community Hall) was created to manage the monies from the sale of property previously dedicated as the Italian Community Hall in Seattle. The mission of this Casa has always been to find a new suitable location and channel the funds from the sale of the previous property to the purchase of the new property to be used for the same purpose, a place for the Italian and Italian-American community members to gather and celebrate the culture that has come from Italy. Over time this same Casa ran into challenges to agree upon new properties. As a workaround, the budgets were amended to support Casa facilitating the member clubs' rental costs for the related general meetings and support some Italian Community events as well. Bylaws were written setting up both a board of Directors and a board of Governors, resulting in nearly 25 board members, and an approval process that required a majority vote by both boards in order to move forward. The original Casa has not been a 501c3 for quite a few years.

Recently, the new Casa (Cultural Center) was created. The work to create a new Casa was required to get a 501c3 charitable status in place (so that donations can be written off taxes), and craft a new board structure that could act quicker to meet the demands of purchasing property. The new Casa has a smaller board of Directors made up of 11 members & does not have a secondary governing board. The similar yet different name was intentional to honor the continued purpose of the establishment of a physical location for our community, and reflect the idea of not just a meeting hall, but a location that would facilitate activities to celebrate all things of Italian origin. Such things include (but are not limited to) language and art in the form of language classes for a variety of student types, a lending library dedicated to books or media in Italian, written by Italians or about Italians, offices for smaller organizations that will include the Italian Honorary Consul, events based on Italian seasonal & holiday occurrences. The difference in name was also influenced in that a functioning charitable Cultural Center is more likely to qualify for grants, than a "meeting hall."

The first Casa (Community Hall) voted across both of its boards to donate the principal amount of their current funds (funds leftover after the Mastro investment became insolvent), \$275,000 to the new Casa, in as *("Two Casas?"... continues on page 5)*

How the voting works:

For well over a year now Dennis Caldirola, our Secretary, has been using Gmail to send out email notices to the membership. In this case a special email will be sent to the members we have on file. The special email will be used to have members cast their vote. Instructions to ensure clear understanding of how to properly cast a vote via the email will be included. Any members who are not using email, will be able to call our President Anna Popovich. The voting period will be one calendar week beginning on Monday December 7th, 2020 & concluding Monday December 14th, 2020. Votes submitted after the deadline will not be counted.

For those interested a tour of the building, please feel free to reach out to Martin Nigrelle. Times can be arranged with Martin or others from the board of the new Casa. COVID prevention efforts are required, which means masks are to be worn & tour groups will be limited in size. Martin's contact information is located on page 2 of the club newsletter.


much as the actions & mission of the new Casa met the purpose with which the first Casa was founded.

At this time the first Casa has a much smaller investment portfolio, but is likely to continue to exist for the duration of the capital campaign of the new Casa. This is in essence a safeguard to ensure that if for any reason the new Casa is forced to sell the property, the old Casa could recover its donation as best as possible. So yes, for now two Casas.


