# il Ficcanaso



### **Doctor Henry Q. Cervi**

#### 1972 Interview by Dennis Caldirola

It is with a certain sense of pride that this month the *il Ficcanaso* reviews the career of Doctor Henry Q. Cervi, the last living charter member of the Italian Club. Today, at 86 years of age, Dr. Cervi retains a distinguished yet somewhat dapper perspective of life in general that marks him as a true gentleman of the world.

Dr. Cervi was born in Bologna on September 20, 1886. At the age of seventeen the responsibility of him supporting his family took him to Rimini where he spent his first days as a dishwasher in a restaurant. Ambition took him onward however, and within a year he had

entered the career of hotel management, a career which took him all over Europe and culminated in 1909 when Canadian Pacific hired him to open the Empress Hotel in Victoria, British Columbia. Dr. Cervi's goals were not yet fully realized for he continued to further his education in his spare time until 1919 when he received his Doctor's degree in Osteopathy from the University of Chicago and he moved to Seattle to open his practice. The post-war years were lean ones however, and after a brief time he found himself back in the world of organization and finance, first employed by Frank Buty and Company and then, in 1923, as an associate of the Italian Exchange and Steamship Company.

In the early part of 1919 a group of Italian business and professional men who used to meet regularly at Paolella's Drugstore at 600 Jackson St., decided to organize formally and found a club designated to developing a higher esteem of Italians and disseminating a greater knowledge of Italian art and culture throughout the Northwest. Among these initial participants were Nick Paolella, Dottori Cervi, Dedonato and Ghiglione, Captain Ferro and Signori Alfani, Borracchini, Magnano and Rosaia. After the initial preparations had been made, a meeting was held at the old Seattle Gas Building on 4th Avenue and Pike Street and the proposition was accepted, by those attending, that a charter be drawn up, a permanent meeting place be secured and a solicitation for members begun. At long last all affairs were in order and on the night of April 20, 1920 the charter was signed and the Italian Commercial Club was officially born.

The organization struggled along for the first few years, short of finances and meeting only on a semi-permanent basis at Belloni's Restaurant in the Stewart Hotel, 521 Madison Street. Finally it was decided to issue \$7,500 in bonds to be bought by the members and with the capital raised by this venture the club purchased the old Jacob Furth mansion on the northeast corner of Ninth Avenue and Terrace Street. It is interesting to note that at the time approximately one-third of the membership was one of non-Italian descent and included such dignitaries as the Mayor of Seattle, the Chief of Police, many judges, justices and councilmen. Among these was the late Judge George Downworth, an avid admirer of Italian culture and Roman jurisprudence, who not only transacted without charge all of the legal affairs of the purchase of the new headquarters, but himself bought \$500 worth of bonds and then later donated them back to the club.

After assuming possession of the property, the members began reconstructing the interior of the home, donating all of their services and working late into the night. The walls were decorated with murals of Italian scenery done by the talented artists Victor Masenga and James Rigo. There was a meeting hall for about 200 people, an enormous kitchen with a banquet service for 150, and living quarters for the caretakers. Thus it was that the Italian community had a beautiful location at which to meet and it was there that they entertained such visiting dignitaries as General Nobile, the first man to fly over the North Pole, the squadron of Air Force officers who flew from Rome to the Chicago Exposition, the tenor Caruso, the basso Pinza, Guglielmo Marconi, and Signore Melba and Tettrazzini.

All good things must draw to a close, however. So it was when in 1928 the area of Ninth Avenue and Terrace Street was selected as the site for the new King County Hospital. The Italian Commercial Club's beautiful headquarters were sold to the County for \$14,000, a profit of 100 percent over the original investment, and the organization started searching for a new place at which to meet. By 1930 they purchased an old Bell Telephone building on 17th Avenue near Union Street. This was refurbished and renamed the Casa Italiana and stood for

several decades as the central meeting place not only for a myriad of organizations, including the Atlantic Street Athletic Club, the Italian Independent Society, and the Sons of Italy, but also for any and all social events within the Italian community as well. Not long thereafter the Italian Commercial Club amalgamated with the Atlantic Street Athletic Club and the Italian Athletic Club and the name was shortened to just the Italian Club as it is still called today. And with that transition, the first epoch in our Club's history had come to an end.

# **Carmen Murray**

Carmen (Carmela) Murray, passed away on January 12, 2020 at the age of 104. She was the first born of five children: Carmella, Concetta (Ellen's mother), Mary Anna, Danny, and Franchesca Greco. Their parents, Francesco & Franchesca, were immigrants from Sicily and settled in Omaha, Nebraska. Francesco was a carpenter for the Union Pacific Railroad and ran a separate business as a cobbler during the Great Depression. Carmen met Neil Murray, a Seattle native, during World War II. They married, and after the war settled in Seattle with their young daughter, Margaret. Concetta and her husband followed Carmen to Seattle. Housing was limited after the war, but the sisters were able to purchase a small apartment building near Roosevelt High School, living in a couple of the units, and earning a small amount of rent from the other units in the building. Later, they sold the building and were able to purchase homes in North Seattle and raise their children. Carmen was very active in the community, and was a volunteer for Senator Scoop Jackson's senate and presidential campaigns. Carmen and her neighbors organized an effort to challenge Washington State during construction of North Seattle Community College when her and her neighbor's homes were condemned for construction of the new campus. They retained a prominent local real estate attorney named John Erlichman (a later Nixon aide involved in the Watergate affair), to challenge the State on just compensation, and their efforts later contributed to federal legislation to ensure rights to citizens subjected to eminent domain proceedings. After her husband retired, Carmen became active in the National Association of Retired and Active Federal Employees, serving in various capacities, including State president. She enjoyed frequent travel to vacation spots and to attend membership conventions of organizations she belonged to. Neil & Carmen also joined the Italian Club, where Neil served as Sergeant of Arms for many years, and Carmen served in various capacities, including President of the Lady's Auxiliary. Carmen was proud of her Italian heritage. She loved the dinner dances, holiday parties, picnics, and other activities of the Italian Club, and enjoyed close friendships with many members of the Club. Her husband passed in 1992, and her daughter passed in 2014. Though the oldest, she outlived all of her siblings, and passed away peacefully on January 12, 2020, eight days after her 104th birthday.
