

il Ficcanaso

Ricette per nostri Aranciacello e Limoncello. Prodotti della Rossi Familia

This is our family's recipe for both orangecello and lemoncello. We produce 12-ounce bottles of each with our own labels. We use 750 ml of 151 proof Everclear and 750 ml of 100 proof vodka. We have tried two 750 ml bottles of Everclear, but it tends to have too high of an alcohol content. Our recipe still keeps the alcohol percent above about 30% so it will not freeze solid in the freezer. The recipe follows.

Ingredients:

- 15 thick skinned lemons or 12 thick skinned oranges
- 1-750 ml bottle of 100 proof vodka
- 1-750 ml bottle of 151 proof Everclear
- 4 cups water
- 5 cups sugar
- 1-2 open top gallon jar (like a glass pickle jar, one can buy them at a wine supply store)
- 8-10, 12-ounce glass bottles with caps (or any bottle shape you like)

Step No. 1

- Wash lemons or oranges in hot water with scrub brush. Pat dry. Peel with vegetable peeler. Peel carefully to avoid the white layer under the skin
- Fill the jar with one 750 ml bottle of 151 Everclear and the lemon or orange peel
- Cover and place in dark location at room temperature for 40 days

Step No. 2

After 40 days:

- Combine sugar and water in saucepan, bring to a boil, cook until thickened, about 5 minutes
- Cool
- Add the solution to the jar along with the 750-ml bottle of 100 proof vodka
- Cover and return to dark location at room temperature for another 40 days

Step No. 3

- Strain into another jar removing the lemon peel
- Then filter through cheese cloth
- · Place in bottles (we use 12-ounce bottles) and caps
- Store in cupboard or freezer, we always have some in the freezer ready to go

Next, we are going to try pink grapefruit cello.

Indulgences

A historical note by Joel Patience

The construction projects and crusades of the Popes brought about not only great buildings and architecture, but it also was the cause for great debt. These projects were considered contrary to legitimate matters of taking care of the impoverished, leper colonies and education of the populous.

Long before this period indulgences were created that promised the holder to pass to heaven or mitigate their time in purgatory (bus stop after death). They were usually reserved for someone that had made benevolent acts on behalf of the church.

In order to keep their projects going however, indulgences were redefined to be sold. Essentially, one could pay for their forgiveness of sins with the exception of mortal sins; as they could also be prosecuted right here on earth during the lifetime of the perpetrator.

As a result the coffers of the church swelled and the projects and acquisitions blossomed. While these practices were in their own right an economic force they were also a great concern. Early in the 1500s a group of economists of the day listed the three greatest causes of inflation at that time. The first being the Pope and his indulgences, second being the minting of debased money and third as cheating by merchants.

Some clergy noticed that indulgences were so successful for the Pope that they considered it their right, as his representatives on earth, to sell them as well. They went so far as to claim falsely in writing that they were authorized by the Pope to make these transactions. A good thing became even more wide spread when indulgences, what were essentially warranties for everlasting life, encompassed larger and larger periods of time to attract the gullible. Many started including lists of sins that the buyer was protected from committing in the transaction during their lifetime. Forgeries of indulgences existed that assured the bearer in excess of 20,000 years of happiness. Later versions doubled that.

So successful were these indulgences focused on specific projects that they acquired nicknames. The so-called "butter tower" of Rouen is rumored to have gotten its name because the sale of indulgences forgave the users of butter during Lent.

While I was unable to find specific modern books on the subject of indulgences, I found many references about historical figures that either called into question, or engaged these financial practices. Many of the clergy that had joined religious groups to lead a simple reverent life protested the practice. Thanks to search engines such as Wikipedia and Google to bring this story together for you.
