#### Albert Vena, ICoS 7th President

Our seventh president, Albert Vena, set himself apart from the other early leaders of the Italian Club by serving three terms of office separated by as much as seven years. President in 1929, 1930 and 1937, Al further distinguished himself by being in office when the Casa Italiana was first purchased, and by devoting himself for so many years to the publication of this

very newspaper.

Albert, the son of Nicola Vena, was born in Seattle on December 28, 1898, and first resided at 1325 6th Avenue where the Washington Athletic Club now stands. His family then moved to 11th and Denny Way from which Al subsequently attended Broadway High School. In 1914, while still in school, Al started working nights at the Art Printing Company which his brother Mike had founded February 22nd of that year. The print shop was located at 412 4th Avenue, and upon graduation from school, Al entered there fulltime as a partner with Mike and their other brother George. fraternal enterprise was to remain Albert's career for the remainder of his life, in total, some fifty-six years.

In 1923 Al met Katherine Varalli whom he married on March 6, 1926, and in 1930, when Al was President, "Katie" entered the Ladies Auxiliary where she has been active ever since. In fact, it was she who one night suggested that Al name the Italian Club bulletin "il Ficcanaso," or "a nosy person," and that is the name it has retained to this day.

Albert continued to publish *il Ficcanaso* until his death on February 5, 1969. His industry, his dedication to his family, as well as five continuous decades of contribution to his community should stand as mementos of a life certainly deserving of emulation.

#### 2020-2021 Scholarship Application

The Italian Club of Seattle is awarding a single \$1,000.00 dollar scholarship. The scholarship for the 2020-2021 school year will be awarded to the student who is selected based on meeting or exceeding the scholarship qualifications (noted below). As in years past; the better the GPA, the better chance of a scholarship award.

#### Steps in the scholarship process:

- April 1, 2020 Application submission window opens.
- May 31, 2020 Application submission window closes, application verification.
- June 2020 Award Recipient determined, all applicants notified of their status.
- September 2020 Award Recipient published in the *il Ficcanaso* and presented at the General Meeting.
- October 2020 Scholarship payment made to the school on behalf of the recipient.

#### The qualifications the recipient needs to meet or exceed are:

- 1. Parents must be in good standing for three years.
- 2. G.P.A must be 3.0 or above.
- 3. Scholarship is paid specifically for tuition, directly to a state accredited High School the recipient attends.
- 4. The scholarship amount is \$1,000.00.
- 5. The scholarship is applied only for the regular school years 9-12.
