# <u>Unto Us a Son is Given</u> by Donna Leon

Donna Leon is an American writer living in Venice. Over the years she has developed a murder mystery series around a fictitious police detective – Commissario Guido Brunetti. The Commissario wife's name is Paola and they have two children. Paola is the daughter of Venetian aristocrats. His father-in-law, Count Falier, has his hands in virtually every aspect of Venetian business and society and calls on Guido to investigate one of his best friends, Gonzalo Rodriguez de Tejada.

The friend is someone they and the community have known and respected for most of their lives. This person is considered to be influential and well to do. As they have no children, and likely due to loneliness and lost love, they pursue the unique idea of adopting a son.

This plan is well known in Italy from as far back as Roman culture. In 44 BC Octavius was away in Albania to finish his military and academic training. While there, he learned that Caesar had been assassinated. He also learned that in Caesar's will he had been made Caesar's adopted son and heir to his personal fortune as well as aristocratic influence.

It would all seem Gonzalo's personal decision. And yet, it would appear that from every corner of his life friends and business acquaintances are determined that he not carry through. # Italian picnic salad

This is one of the easiest salads to make and certainly to enjoy.

Cut the top off a seedless watermelon. Hollow it out including the cap into a bowl the size of the melon.

Cut up into small bite sizes; cantaloupe, pineapple, grapes and don't forget the Italian plums if you have some. Mix it with the

melon that you took out of the watermelon.

Put as much of the fruit mix as you can back into the melon carcass without smashing the pieces. Cover it with the cap you cut off.

Add one to one and a half cups of limoncello and, if you like, a cup of clear vodka.

Put it into the refrigerator overnight. Share with friends or just tell them you are stuck at home eating fruit salad.


