Payments made to the schools on behalf of the recipients .

The qualifications each recipient needs to meet or exceed are:

- 1. A parent of the applicant (student) must be in good standing in the Italian Club for at least three years. (Grandparents are not included).
- 2. The parent(s) of the applicant must attend at least three club meetings during the year.
- 3. The applicant (student) is enrolled in high school (grades 9 through 12) for the 2012-2013 school years, in the greater Seattle area
- 4. The applicant (student) must have a grade point average of 3.0 or higher (with official transcript) and take part in extracurricular activities, community service, etc.
- 5. Each applicant must write a letter telling about themselves and activities in which he/she is participating.
- 6. The application and transcript must be post marked no earlier than April 1st 2012 and no later than May 1st 2012.
- 7. Applications that are incomplete or missing a transcript will not be considered.

Sharing recipes is a very important part of our everyday culinary experience. That's why so many cook books and magazine are out there in the market place. But best of all, sharing recipes with others you know has a wonderful bonding feeling and so I was asked to share with you each month a few of my favorite recipes along with traditions and possibly regional specialties. Today I am going to give you a little bio of myself and ask you for help with a favorite marinated wild mushroom that my mother prepared when I was a child and walk down memory lane in spring. As some of you know, I spent my younger childhood in Yakima WA in Terrace Heights. My mother, Jeanette Macchia was from Rainer Valley her home in Mount Virgin. My father August Matteo was born and raised in Yakima. We were surrounded by orchards of apples, peaches, and cherries. Spring is a very special time with blossoms everywhere. Every spring my father would forage for mushrooms by large tree stumps in pastures after the first spring rains my mother marinated them in a tangy tomato sauce then canned them in quart sized mason jars. The strips were the length of the jar or bigger. I bet each mushroom did at least two or three jars. They were a great luncheon treat on crunchy Italian bread with her canned roasted red peppers. They were used mostly when we had special guests. Another treat for spring were the wild asparagus that grew profusely throughout the orchards. Every afternoon we were sent out to pick them for our evening meal. Those were the days when dinner was on the table at 5:30 p.m. sharp and with those dinners you might have another spring treat of a wonderful rhubarb sauce with pork or after dinner a special rhubarb

strawberry pie. Oh thank you Lord for many blessing and good memories. If anyone knows about these mushrooms, what kind they are and how they were marinated, I surely would love to hear from you. Check out recipes for asparagus frittata, cream of asparagus soup or prosciutto wrapped asparagus. God bless you, Judy Lewis

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
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
