After Pareto made his observation and created his formula, many others observed similar phenomena in their own areas of expertise. Quality Management pioneer, Dr. Joseph Juran, working in the US in the 1930s and 40s recognized a universal principle he called the "vital few " and reduced it to writing. As a result, Dr. Juran's observation of the "vital few ", the principle that 20 percent of something always are responsible for 80 percent of the results, became known as Pareto's Principle or the 80/20 Rule. The value of the Pareto Principle is that it reminds you to focus on the 20 percent that matters. Of the things you do during your day, only 20 percent really matter. Those 20 percent produce 80 percent of your results. Identify and focus on those things. . Apply the Pareto Principle to all you do, but use it wisely. I think we are working on the right things and continue to welcome in new members into the Italian Club of Seattle. My focus will continue to be on the fun factor for the club and it's members and foresee that 80% of our time together will be delightful. Hopefully I will see you at the Mariners, Emerald Downs and the Italian Community Picnic this summer. We are a social club creating life experiences and memories and all it takes is just being incredibly you and come join us . 



## Who is Alex Liddi? -- Mariners Italian Heritage Night 2012

For those of you who may have missed it, Alex Liddi scored his first major league grand-slam against the Texas Rangers on May 23rd, which led to a win for the Mariners! Alex Liddi became the first player born and raised in Italy to hit a home run in the Major Leagues since 1961. The giveaway item this year is a customized t-shirt that includes Alex Liddi's name & number (see illustration). There are less than 10 seats left in the group of 57 seats the Italian club has purchased. If you want to sit with your fellow club members see Marty Nigrelle for available seats at the June 7th meeting. Tickets are also available via the Mariners web site until Noon Wednesday June 13th : http://mariners.com/italian. Tickets will be sold on a first come first serve basis. This year the Mariners will be hosting the San Diego Padres on Thursday June 14th, 7:10pm. The Mariners are still working on a possible pre-game event as well, any news will be posted to the Mariners Italian Heritage web site. The ticket prices this year are: \$14 View Reserved (normally \$15) \$30 Field Level (normally \$35). The Mariners are donating \$2.00 from the sale of each ticket to Festa Italiana.



#### Pappardelle (wide thin pasta)

One pork loin or boar meat (about two kg minimum) One large red onion 1 stick of celery 2 garlic cloves or two table spoons of crushed garlic 1 sprig of rosemary 1 sprig of sage

Stock as needed 1 portabella mushroom Tomato purees (250g) Red wine 6 Juniper berries (optional) Pinch of nutmeg Fresh black pepper Extra virgin olive oil



Grated parmesan or pecorino

Finley chop the herbs and vegetables and cook gently in a deep, heavy based pad with olive oil until they begin to soften. Dice the pork or cut it into long strips and start to cook it with the vegetables and add a little olive oil. Remove the pork just when it starts to turn color then dice it into small pieces or, for more flavor, turn the cooked pork though your cylinder grater (large holes) and return to the cooking pan. Shred the portabella mushroom with a cheese grater and add it to the pan. This will disperse the flavors and moisture throughout the dish.

When the meat starts to brown add the red wine and tomato puree and cook slowly without the lid. The sauce is ready when the meet has taken on a darker color and the mixture has thickened. Stock can be added to thin the sauce. When the ragu is almost ready, drop the Pappardelle and salt into boiling water only until al dente. Drain the pasta. Fold in the ragu and half the parmesan. Sprinkle the rest of the cheese on the top and serve.
