In My Own Words by Italian Club Member Vincent Ferrese

Vincent Ferrese

La Mia Famiglia Storia

Sure, our families go back hundreds of years, buy why is it that for most of us, it all starts with our grandparents? Both sets of my grandparents immigrated to America from Italy. While I cherished all four of them, I became best acquainted with my mother's parents, Vincenzo and Antonuzza Bellissimo. It's not that I didn't like my dad's side, but my mother kept the social calendar, and low and behold, we ended up for Sunday dinners at my maternal grandparents house more often than not. Now, it didn't hurt that grandpa always had a stash of those big Hershey bars for the kids and homemade

wine on hand for my dad while grandma kept the fridge full of flavored soda pop.

My grandfather was one of five boys raised in the southern Italian village of Villalonga. The five brothers were born between the years 1874 and 1893, with my grandfather, Vincenzo, being the youngest. Growing up in a small town made it easier for my grandfather to court and marry my grandmother, whose union has allowed me the opportunity to write this story.

Around 1915 these two love-birds got hitched and shortly thereafter, they sailed to the land of plenty, America, where they met up with grandpa's four older brothers. The boys all worked in the coalmines of SW Pennsylvania. It was a dirty and claustrophobic job that none of them particularly cared for, so they jumped at the opportunity to go west working for the Union Pacific Railroad. Not long into their journey, while working in Wyoming, their boss absconded with their entire pay, never to be seen again. How did they get home with little or no money, you ask? Heading back east, they hooked up with a wild-west show, and before long reunited with their loved ones in Pennsylvania. Back to the coalmines they went!

Now back with his lovely wife, Antonuzza, my grandparents had their first of six children, Rosa my mom, who was born in 1921. When my mother was just seven years old tragedy hit the family when two of grandpa's brothers died in the 1928 Mather Pennsylvania coalmine explosion. My grandpa would have been in that horrific explosion had he not been sick at home that day. Needless to say, my grandfather never returned to the coalmines. At the same time, the steel mills of Pittsburgh were unionizing and with grandpa being, shall we say "connected", he entered the factory and we became "Steelers". Shortly after, grandpa focused on passing his U.S. citizenship exams. Now remember, my mom was born prior to her parent's becoming U.S. citizens, which meant that she was a dual citizen of Italy and the United States. "Big deal", you might think, but that detail has allowed my three boys and me to obtain our dual citizenships as recently as 2011. I am grateful for this for two reasons: 1. It has brought me full circle back to my Italian roots and heritage and 2. It will allow my boys the opportunity to work in any EU country should they so choose.

My mom and dad met in 1940 with dad quickly heading off to Africa to serve five years in WWII. I recall him telling of the difficult emotional time fighting his fellow Italians in Italy as well as witnessing the death by firing squad followed by the upside-down hanging of Mussolini in April of 1945. I was born in 1949 (the second of four) and, with a large extended family I was instilled with the values of my Italian heritage and culture. Around age ten, I realized that my life's profession

The Italian Club of Seattle is awarding up to three individual \$500.00 scholarships. The scholarships for the 2013-2014 school year will be awarded to students who are selected based on meeting or exceeding the scholarship criteria (noted below). As in years' past; the better the GPA, the better chance of scholarship award.

Next steps in the scholarship process:

- May 2013 Application submission window closes, application verification
- June 2013 Award Recipients determined in the June board meeting, all applicants notified of their status
- September 2013 Award Recipients published in the il Ficcanaso and presented @ General Meeting
- October 2013 Scholarship payments made to the schools on behalf of the recipients

The qualifications each recipient needs to meet or exceed are:

- 1. A parent of the applicant (student) must be in good standing in the Italian Club for at least three years. (Grandparents are not included).
- 2. The parent(s) of the applicant must attend at least three club meetings during the year.
- 3. The applicant (student) is enrolled in high school (grades 9 through 12) for the 2013-2014 school year, in the greater Seattle area
- 4. The applicant (student) must have a grade point average of 3.0 or higher (with official transcript) and take part in extracurricular activities, community service, etc.
- Each applicant must write a letter telling about themselves and activities in which he/she is participating.
- 6. The application and transcript must be post marked no earlier than April 15th 2013 and no later than May 10th 2013.
- 7. Applications that are incomplete or missing a transcript will not be considered.
