#### Message from the President

This has been a very busy year and I want to thank my Board members for all their help and support. I also want to thank Gemma Di Julio Thielges and Angela Di Julio Wright for the Health & Welfare column. The column provides club members with important and entertaining information, which enables us all to keep informed of those members we don't always see. This is a very integral part of the *il Ficcanaso* and I appreciate all their hard work and efforts.

A few months back the club was informed by Mt. Virgin that they did not wish to continue renting the hall for our meetings. The space was needed for The Nativity School. Fr. Paul wrote a letter to the Archdiocese and the club received a reprieve. With this in mind, I have been pursuing a new location for a meeting space. ## The Death of Caesar, Published by Simon & Schuster - 226 pages A Review by Joel Patience

So you think you know everything about Italy and its history? But did you know that everyone could become Roman – like it or not? At the time of the assassination of Julius Caesar March 15, 44 B.C. you might have been born into a Roman family or were doing business with Rome at the far reaches of the Empire. But many people that were not born anywhere near what we know as modern Italy (after the 1870 Unification) became citizens of Roman Italy and some even became senators.

In many situations it might have been by choice, as it was healthier to become a citizen than oppose the advancing of the Empire. In other cases, some established societies chose to argue the point and wound up conquered (annexed) and some of their peoples put up for auction (servitude) or put up for public entertainment (execution). Even so, those commonly seen as outsiders – slaves, local support that never lived in Italy for the Roman military, even conquered societies could become Roman. In the eyes of Rome, every person had some value, some contribution to be made; some just made over longer periods than others.

The newly released book of history's most famous assassination is a "who done it" as one would read any good murder mystery. It is also however, an account of what easily are current events. Nearly every page has some little item that might appear and reflect the news of modern times. It might be an inflated construction project, subsidized housing in exchange for votes, public figures ignoring the reality of public opinion, and government - expanding by force if needed to acquire more and more taxes. The actions of what we think of as ancient Rome, set the standards for current civil structure as well as civic consumption and perceptions of an entire society; all while tolerating a certain degree of personal freedoms for citizens.

The death of Julius Caesar is a given in history. Author Barry Strauss however, leads the reader through a cast of plotting characters, clear time lines and the relationships that ultimately have Caesar dead by the middle of the book. Yet, for those of you that are certain of your recent geographic origins - will be left wondering about linage.

Following the assassination of Caesar there were half a dozen armies formed by those wanting to take over control the Empire and the great profits that came with leadership. These groups fought, at times some merged then, realigned; all to have the purse strings. To aspire to their own goals the leaders acquired military assistance from the far reaches of the Empire's societies; bringing in slaves, foreign warriors, gladiator bodyguards, converted enemy armies and even paid mercenaries. Then they borrowed money from family and friends to keep their lofty dreams alive including paying hefty interest on the loans. Their outcomes are part of the second half of the book.

This approach to civil wars was repeated over time and ultimately changed the political and blood work of Roman society. The population swelled each time Rome overtook a large group and in the post Caesar case this certainly involved grasping resources from acquired civilizations and cultures. Naturally, when all was said and done, not everyone that survived to go home actually went. When they did, a little bit of Roman Italy was taken along with each person and a little of their original culture and often genetics was left behind.

As it always has been; the future of any culture is in the hands of those that cherish it the most and are willing to share it purely for pres-


