Reno to enjoy Festa Reno. Some celebrate in smaller groups or as individuals. Frankly, there are a significant number of people who simply do not celebrate the holiday.

It may be hard for the non-Italian-American people in the area to understand what Columbus Day has come to mean in the Italian-American community. Italians in Italy do not celebrate Columbus. As such, those who are recent immigrants to the USA from Italy are not aware of the value the holiday has held for the Italian-American community of which they have become members. The holiday is recognized inconsistently at various levels of government and celebrations in different cities are hardly standardized. In New York they continue to hold a Columbus Day Parade and a street party afterward. In San Francisco on Columbus Day they have a parade too, but is has been named the Italian Heritage Parade. In Los Angeles city employees may choose to celebrate (take the day off of work) either Ceasar Chavez Day or Columbus Day, a city compromise from 2002, and in 2016 they have a city council considering the renaming of the day to Indigenous People's Day. The state of California stopped recognizing the holiday in an effort to cut costs in 2009. In Boston they have multiple festivals and a parade on the Sunday before Columbus Day. In Atlanta it is largely a day to begin one's Christmas shopping based on the sales.

Whether it be the polarizing name of Columbus (painted as the archetype for colonialism) or because of the inconsistency of the holiday's celebration here and across the nation, it is not a holiday that currently carries the same weight or recognition as some other ethnic based holidays such as St. Patrick's Day (an individual of Roman decent by the way). It should be recognized that Columbus Day in recent years (some would argue decades) has really become a day to celebrate Italian-American heritage and culture, not just the efforts of one man, but the efforts of those who have risen to the challenges of coming to a new world, to persevere, and to become significant and integrated in that new world. It is with that in mind, that efforts were made to renew the Columbus Night Dinner.

It was not simply about Christopher Columbus. It was about bringing together our local Italian-American community, whether it was someone from the Italian Club, or the Sons of Italy, from San Gennaro, or Festa Italiana, from the Dante Society, or Westside, etc. The event is about recognizing our heritage, our community's contribution to the Seattle area, and celebrating those things.

We will work to make our community together, to celebrate together, and be a community recognized by the general public. Recognized not for one man, but for the contributions of the many. Many who were immigrants or the children of immigrants who struggled to make their way and to make their mark, while making Seattle a better place. From the 40 people last year, we will work to make this a bigger and more prominent event, one that people outside our community take note of. From the Acorn Grows the Oak (article title translated).
