

plane flight. I had a feeling that this extra time would be required based on how difficult it was to return a rental car to Firenze a few years earlier - but that is another story. We had a great dinner the night before and breakfast in the morning prior to leaving. We said ciao to all our new friends and said we would be back. Indications were we were good to go. After an hour or so, we were well on our way to the airport.

Then brake lights and more brake lights, which slowed us to about 10 km per hour. Unknown to us, and based on the traffic unknown to a lot of other people, the road crews had closed the freeway southbound for the entire day. This is like closing I-5 southbound for an entire day and not letting anybody know. The Italians, some of them were driving off the freeway using the onramps, which was exciting to watch. We stayed the course and in about two hours, we were at the "traffic circle from hell." This was the traffic circle, that people who thought they were going southbound, were using to get to the back roads. I am sure if we had time, he would have taken us home to meet his family for lunch. We finally made it to the airport in time to catch our plane to Paris. ### Holiday Fundraising Drive to Benefit Homeless Veterans Tony La Stella, International Concert & Recording Artist


